Project spotlight

For many large organisations, reporting is a necessary evil. Sprawling spreadsheets, duplicated data, and time-consuming manual processes can drain resources and delay decisions.

But reporting doesn't have to be a burden. It can be a powerful tool for transformation.

That was the goal when our team partnered with a major government department to tackle the challenge of fragmented data and inconsistent reporting. The brief was simple but ambitious: create a single source of truth that leadership could trust, without adding to the workload of busy teams.

The result was the Report Once Solution (RoS). Built using Azure, SharePoint, Power BI, and a custom React portal, the solution automates data collection, applies governance controls, and provides real-time insights that support faster and better decision-making.

It is a practical example of what we heard reinforced at the recent 6Degrees.Al conference. Technology only delivers real value when it aligns with business strategy. Data and Al projects succeed when they solve human problems, not just technical ones. In this case, the real challenge was giving teams clarity and freeing up their time to focus on what matters most.

Since going live, RoS has improved data quality, reduced duplication, and helped leadership teams move from reactive reporting to proactive decision-making. With hundreds of users and growing, it is enabling a culture of accountability, insight, and continuous improvement.

This project is a reminder that great solutions aren't always about more data or more dashboards. The real measure of success is better conversations, smarter decisions, and stronger teams.
